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2.3 Trimming of Trees (Piper)

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SOR Piper indicated that tree/limb management is and probably always will be an ongoing task.

- 58 There are a number of known problem areas that must be addressed before injury or damage occurs. Former Road Agent Oleson (not present) had tried many times to obtain funding for
- 60 proactive management of trees/limbs posing threats in rights-of-way, but his requests were denied. The two full-time Highway employees (plus SOR Piper when available) are regularly
- 62 working on trees they are able to access; however, tree companies with bucket/crane trucks are required to be hired at times which is very expensive.

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Since this is an ongoing issue, Chairman Berube will remove this from the HSC agenda.

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Ms. Pacheco: She thanked the Committee for their assistance getting the speed limit reduced to 25 MPH on the unpaved portion of Halls Village Rd.; it has been a great help.

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SOR Piper: The Fremont Rd. bridge should be wear coursed this week. Guard rails are presently being installed on Lane Rd. at the recent beaver dam washout location. North Pond Rd. guard rails are presently being addressed as well.

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Town Planner Hadik: Mr. Dunn with NHDOT (not present) will present two options to rework the 102/121 intersection to the Planning Board on November 8th. SNHPC's 10-year plan still includes the reworking of the center intersection & the Shepard Home Rd. bridge. Last week Mr. Hadik attended a presentation with the Transportation Advisory Committee featuring high-tech traffic study equipment. The developers of the proposed SanChester development met with the

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Planning Board recently and discussed the four-way intersection that will be created when the new road is added across from the south entrance of Jenkins Farm Rd.

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Police Chief Berube: the I-93 Exit 4A project will have a major impact on traffic in Chester; but the NHDOT is trying to stay ahead of it.

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The remaining representatives had nothing to report.

Any Other New Business

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3.3.1 Radar Trailer

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Chairman Berube mentioned that the All Traffic Solutions radar trailer subscription renewal cost was \$1,500. Without this subscription, nothing can be done with the data that the radar trailer collects. The HSC recommends the subscription be renewed for another year and charged to the IT budget line; and to reassess moving forward. The data collected by this equipment will be crucial in developing plans to manage speed limits on Town roads.

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
- The next meeting of the Highway Safety Committee is scheduled for Wednesday, December 20, 2023, at 9:00am in the Town Hall meeting room.
