86 **1. Finalize Drafts of the Annual Report and handout for School**

88 The BC discussed proper wording for the School District green sheet
89 handout as well as the Annual Report including but not limited to
90 removing opinionated language.

92 **Mr. Heuer made a motion to accept the Annual Report with changes.**
93 **The motion was seconded by Dr. Owens. 5 in favor, 1 opposed, no**
94 **abstentions, 1 absent.**

96 Vice Chair Lamphere -Should the cleaned up spreadsheet be attached to the handout?

98 Selectman D'Angelo – Our town does not even compare to the comparable neighboring
99 towns used, it is unfair to try to catch up with towns that have over \$100,000,000 more in
100 valuation. Valuations - Auburn is almost \$665 million, Weare \$820 million, Rye \$2
101 billion, Chester can't compete with those kinds of salaries. Also, looking at the State of
102 NH County Population Projection of Municipality produced by the NH Office of Energy
103 and Planning and the Regional Planning Commission shows that by 2020 Weare –
104 projected to be 9,000 and Chester 5,200, Auburn, 5,500, or 6,000 people. They don't
105 match up.

107 Mr. Heuer – Our economy hangs by a thread, we're not keeping up with the rest of the
108 world. We're falling further and further behind, we can't be \$20 trillion in debt and
109 interest rates are going up not down. Diesel fuel has gone up dramatically again. A big
110 part of the economy hinges on that because everything that moves uses diesel.
111

112 Selectman D'Angelo – Why are we building budgets and administrative positions in for
113 some future potential issue that we don't know if it's actually going to happen. There's a
114 drop in student population and class size, but very few changes in staffing have happened
115 recently.

117 Vice Chair Lamphere – The homes that are being put up are starter homes, or a little
118 better than starter homes so perhaps we're two or three years out for the impact on
119 schools. In 2000, or 2001 there was a development off of Jennifer Drive that when people
120 moved in, they were all young kids but it was a big hit when they reached school age.
121

122 Mr. Shankey – Part of what the town has done well collectively in the past is managing
123 these increases, however I shared my feelings and this seems to be more than is
124 necessary.

126 Dr. Owens – There's a lack of getting information out to the public. The BC denying the
127 contract sparked a lot of controversy on the Front Porch. They seem shocked; we're
128 doing a poor job of getting information out because though people should do their
129 research, they may not be. Perhaps the comparison chart could be added to the document
130 that will be handed out to the townspeople for their understanding? People are taking
131 their information at face value and not looking into it themselves.
132

133 Mr. Heuer – Rather than sending out the whole sheet, we could put a sentence sharing
134 that we have looked at the towns that the school board has mentioned, and none of them
135 compare to Chester so it's an unfair comparison.

Mr. Shankey – People may look quickly at a sheet, but I think it needs to be in a presentation to make a statement rather than on a piece of paper that people have to dig through. Though I agree with what is here, if that sheet is handed out, it may be a lot for them to go through.

Vice Chair Lamphere – I do think the attendance will be better this time around with so much on the table. We came to a conclusion; some people will think we're right, some people will think we aren't right. The numbers are correct and people will have to make their choice if they want to support that or not. The school board will probably be doing some sort of similar presentation as such was presented to the BC. It would be important to have something shared about why the BC supported the school budget, but not the contract.

Vice Chair Lamphere – A catchy titled letter to the editor could also help get some information out for people to see more easily.
