VI. BOS Update – Liaison Steph Landau

Selectman Landau said that there are two petition warrant articles: one to change Columbus Day to Indigenous Peoples' Day, and one to change the Town to an SB2 Town. He explained that at Town meeting there must be a written ballot with a 3/5th Town vote for the SB2 to pass. Selectman Landau said that this may not have enough signatures yet to be a petition warrant article.

VII. School Board Update – Liaison Brennan Holmes

Chester School Board (CSB) Chair Richardson came before the Committee to update them on the House Bill 1691. He said that the CSB will be testifying at the Public Hearing in favor of House Bill 1691. CSB Chair Richardson explained that HB 1691 has been introduced to correct the funding for Kindergarten; they were shorted about \$49,000 after the removal of Kenogarten revenue as a funding mechanism.

CSB Chair Richardson said that if this should pass it will mean approximately an \$80,000 swing back to the Town. He thinks will possibly come after this year and will go into the unreserved fund.

CSB Chair Richardson thanked the Representatives and Senators for taking action on this issue.

a. School Budget Direction

87 Chair Weider invited the CSB members to join the Committee at the meeting table.

89	Chair Richardson, Ms. Weider, and Mr. Eckerman joined the Committee at the meeting table to discuss			
90 91	and review the Committee's questions on the Chester School Budget from last week's meeting.			
92	Chair Weider reviewed the reductions and direction for the School Budget which were discussed at the			
93	last meeting:			
94	Enrichment			
95	Ball field irrigation			
96 97	Busing from after school from Pinkerton			
98	Chair Weider said that they should take the buffer machine out of the budget and purchase it outright.			
99				
100	Chair Weider explained that the School Budget is a bottom line budget and they can take out or leave in			
101	whatever they choose, but the Budget Committee had asked for the CSB to reduce the budget by			
102	\$100,000.			
103				
104	The Committee and the CSB had much discussion about the Pinkerton after-school bus.			
105				
106	Vice Chair Lamphere said that although she understands that the budget is a bottom line budget, she			
107 108	does not want the after-school bus to stay in the budget.			
109	The Committee and the CSB had much discussion about how and which stipend positions are funded.			
110				
111	Ms. Rich reviewed with the Committee the stipend positions that are being funded.			
112				
113	CSB Chair Richardson explained that this budget is for the next school year; the programs that they have			
114	listed are programs that they hope to have next year and they funded them in the budget because they			
115	intend to run the programs next year.			
116				
117	CSB Chair Richardson said that if the Budget Committee wants to ask the CSB to reduce the budget by a			
118	certain amount of money they need to ask and then the CSB will review the budget to see what they car			
119	reduce.			
120				
121	The Committee and the CSB continued discussing specific line items of the School Budget.			
122				
123	CSB Chair Richardson asked for clarification from the Committee if they are looking for an overall			
124	reduction of the budget of \$100,000 or removal of specific line items.			
125				
126	The Committee said that they are looking for a reduction in the budget of \$100,000.			
127				
128	Superintendent Lockwood came before the Committee to speak at 7:58 pm.			
129				
130	Superintendent Lockwood said that the school tax rate between Local and State went down 21.5% last			
131	year; he said that he is concerned by the words and implications of what was said earlier and that the			

Public listening will hear that the increase is because of the school. Superintendent Lockwood said that

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133 134	the increase in the evaluations and the Town increase of 3.5% added up to be the increase in the tax rate.	
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136	Chair Weider clarified that kindergarten may not have impacted the tax rate the first year, but that	
137 138	every year after, kindergarten will have an impact by increasing the tax rate.	
139	Selectman Landau advised that everyone had to work together to bring down the costs to the taxpayer;	
140	he noted that the School Budget and the Town Budget are put together and that the taxpayer pays one	
141	tax bill, not a School tax bill and a Town tax bill.	
142		
143	Superintendent Lockwood said that if the CSB agrees to cut out \$100,000 that the Budget Committee is	
144	requesting, and they get the additional \$83,000 as discussed earlier, and the Budget and the CESPA are	
145	approved, then the Budget will cost \$0.12 per thousand and CESPA will cost \$0.04 per thousand.	
146		
147	The Committee and CSB Chair discussed keeping the boiler replacement in the CIP.	
148		
149	Chair Weider said that the boiler replacement should be kept in the CIP.	
150		
151	The CSB and the Public departed the meeting at 8:04 pm.	
152		
153	The Committee discussed the CESPA contract.	
154 155	The Committee discussed PACT costs, and who should pay the costs for the program.	
156	The committee discussed FACT costs, and who should pay the costs for the program.	
157	The Committee discussed the CIP and the costs of the Highway Department and road work.	
158	The committee diseassed the on and the costs of the manay separament and road work.	
159	The Committee had an initial review of the drafts of warrant articles.	
160		
161	The Committee discussed which member will be composing the Budget Committee summary report.	
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163	Mr. Dobbins suggested that the Committee use absolute dollar amounts rather than using percentages	
164	when discussing budgets.	
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166	Vice Chair Lamphere agreed.	
167		
168	The CSB returned to the join the Budget Committee at the meeting table at 9:00 pm.	
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170	CSB Chair Richardson said that the School Board has reviewed the School Budget and have reduced it by	
171	\$100,000; this reduction puts the total School Budget at \$12,792,364, which equals \$0.12 per thousand	
172	and the CESPA contract is \$0.04 per thousand.	
173		
174	The CSB departed at 9:11 pm.
