2.2 Line Striping

56

- Town Administrator Doda mentioned a draft warrant article for line marking is being proposed for Town Meeting. The Board of Selectmen have asked for the committee's recommendations on what roads, and if the roads should have center lines, fog lines or both. Town Planner Hadik
- stated the estimate he received is for a single yellow line. The single line would deter drivers from driving in the middle of the roadways. Chief Berube feels the estimate is high and
- suggested contacting other towns to inquire on what they pay. Road Agent Oleson mentioned the line striping will need to be refreshed every three years. The Committee is in agreement that
- only the center line will be recommended.
- The Committee went thru a list of roads suggested by the Town Planner Hadik. The list of recommended roads: Candia Road, East Derry Road, Fremont Road, Hale True Road, Hanson
- / Shepard Home Road, Lane Road, Towle Road, and Webster Lane. Halls Village Road is on the list to be rebuilt and the lines will be done by the paving company. Town Planner Hadik
- 70 prioritized the three longest roads in Chester to be done first.
- Town Administrator Doda mentioned a warrant article tabled in 2020, asking to collect a \$5.00 per vehicle fee for transportation improvements. Line striping on roads would be an acceptable
- use of the money.
- The wording and amount being requested on a warrant article for line striping was discussed.
- 78 Mr. LaVita feels the town roads do need lines however more quotes should be acquired. Chief Berube suggested Industrial Traffic Lines in Londonderry who has done work for Raymond in
- the past or calling surrounding Towns and asking who they use and a rough estimate on what they are charged.

- Chief Berube mentioned a request for action was sent for a blind driveway issue. Road Agent Oleson advised this has been addressed.
- 88 2.4 Speed Limit Signage Halls Village Road
- Ohief Berube stated a resident had concerns with the speed limit being increased from 25 to 30 on Halls Village Road. It is a safety hazard for walkers and horses. Road Agent Olson advised
- the speed limit has always been 30 MPH. Every town road in Chester is 30 MPH except Dump Road and East Derry Road.

Road Agent Oleson suggested if the resident feels the speed limit should be dropped to 25 MPH they would need to go before the Board of Selectmen. "Caution horse" signs were placed on the road previously from too many complaints.

108 3.1 Accident Reports – September 1, 2022 through December 1, 2022

- All members of the Highway Safety Committee were provided accident status reports for September 1, 2022, through December 1, 2022; please see attached.
- Chairman Berube explained that there were 17 reportable and 1 non-reportable accidents in this report; with 2 injuries.
- Flashing Stop signs at the center of town were discussed, but NH Department of Transportation has the ultimate control for that section. The flashing school sign was thought to be on all year even during the summer. Superintendent Locke advised the sign is on a timer during the school
- year including summer school.

3.2 Reports from Departments

Town Planner Hadik:

- Town Planner Hadik stated the design work for the center of town has been pushed back again due to the department being reorganized.
- Town Planner Hadik mentioned the traffic impact on Fremont Road with trucks leaving the Garabedian gravel pit every four to six minutes. The trucks will be sharing the road with school busses for about two hours per day. Chief Berube and Chief Gladu mentioned a conversation with a resident who is going to propose the trucks drive one way in on Fremont Road and one way out Old Sandown Road. Road Agent Oleson is not in favor.

Fire Chief Gladu: Nothing to report.

Mr. LaVita:

- Mr Lavita has concerns with all the additional dump trucks on the road and the possibility of more people passing the trucks.
- Town Administrator Doda: Nothing to report.
- Maintenance Director Cavanaugh: Nothing to report.

Superintendent Locke:

- Superintendent Locke thanked the Fire and Police Departments for their support. It is much appreciated.
- The sand and plow contracts are up this year and the school will be going out to bid. Superintendent Locke inquired about a possible partnership with the town. Road Agent Oleson advised it is a possibility in the future, but the school would have to pay a fee for the services.

Mr. Methot:

Mr. Methot thanked everyone who helped with the 300th celebrations. According to the

accident report there were no accidents on the day of the parade. It is unknown if any 154 accidents in the center of town during September and October were because of scarecrows. 156


