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Review & Approve minutes for the April 3, 2019 Meeting

- The Board reviewed the minutes from the April 3, 2019 meeting.
- 57 Mr. Weider motioned to approve the minutes from April 3, 2019, as written; Mr. Sederquest seconded
- the motion. Mr. Snyder abstained. Motion approved, 4-0-1.
- 59 Review documentation & discuss recommendation to BOS of Marden Lane acceptance as a Town
- 60 **Road.**
- 61 Planning Coordinator Hadik noted the developer has met all regulations and provided all
- 62 documentation. The As-Built Plan has been reviewed and the site has been walked twice by the Town'
- 63 Road Agent, Michael Oleson, and Engineer, Jeff Adler, this past week and last Fall. DuBois & King
- 64 confirmed all bills are paid. There is a signed and notarized warranty deed for the Right-of-Way
- approved by the Town Attorney. There is also a lien-free certification by Attorney Sumner Kalman. The
- 66 Board moved to authorize Mr. Hadik to draft a letter to advise the Board of Selectmen that the road is
- 67 ready for acceptance.
- 68 Mr. Weider motioned to accept Marden Lane for adoption as a Town road. Chair Sullivan seconded
- 69 the motion, with all in favor, approved 5-0-0.
- 70 Discuss BOS question whether CIP update process can be completed two months earlier.
- 71 Planning Coordinator Hadik, for discussion purposes, received an inquiry from the Board of Selectmen
- asking if the annual update and adoption of the CIP could be accomplished two months earlier than
- 73 normal. Mr. Weider opined the purpose driving this request may be consideration of having an earlier
- 74 Town Meeting closer to the School District Meeting so the taxpayers will see the total impact. Mr.
- 75 Snyder noted cooperation from all of the Department Heads would be crucial. Mr. Weider
- 76 recommended setting a cut-off deadline for information to be received from them.

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- 78 Discuss the Recreation Commission's request for the release of \$20K in impact fees for the Fitness
- 79 Trail project.
- 80 Planning Coordinator Hadik, for discussion purposes, provided the Board with a copy received from the
- 81 Recreation Director dated April 8, 2019 which states the Recreation Commission is requesting an Impact
- 82 Fee expenditure not to exceed \$20,000 for the Capital Improvements Project listed as Fitness Trail and
- 83 further requests the Planning Board submit a letter to the Board of Selectmen at the earliest possible
- date confirming that the request qualifies as a CIP expenditure.
- Mr. Hadik noted the project had been cut from the CIP last November because of a lack of support from
- 86 the Planning Board, the BOS and the Budget Committee. He said there is also some confusion over
- 87 when the updated CIP takes effect. At the date of adoption at the end of January, or does it run co-
- 88 currently with the fiscal year?
- 89 Mr. Weider noted if the trail was not supported by any of three Boards then it should not have been in
- 90 the CIP. He also noted impact fees would not exist if it were not for the CIP.
- 91 Mr. Snyder recommended asking the Recreation Commission for the justification for the request. He
- also suggested checking with Counsel when the updated CIP takes effect.

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Ms. Richter motioned to open the application of Eversource Energy (PSNH) for a Conditional Use Permit (CUP). Mr. Weider seconded the motion, with all in favor, approved 5-0-0.

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Mr. Hadik provided the Board members with a copy of the Conservation Commission's letter of approval dated April 10, 2019 which cited no additional comments or restrictions requested.

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Chair Sullivan opened the hearing to the public for questions and comments at 7:25 PM.

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- Lindsey White and Anthony Domiano from GZA GeoEnvironmental (GZA) presented the application.
- 108 Twenty utility poles would be replaced: Nine along Line 391 and eleven along Line 373. The area is off
- 109 Pingree Hill Road and Bridle Path. The poles are 50 years old and were identified during the last
- inspection as needing to be replaced. The wooden poles would be replaced with steel ones.

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Mr. Hadik noted Tighe & Bond were here last Fall for a permit for Eversource to replace the worst poles and now GZA are here for a permit to do the remaining ones.

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115 Ms. White stated there will be the same wetland impacts as reviewed before.

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- 117 Mr. Weider asked why these poles, and why were they not done all at once? Jeremy Fennell from
- 118 Eversource explained the inspection process and prioritization. Line 345 was inspected last year. As a

Planning Board Meeting. 119 result of this year's inspection another bunch of poles were failed. Woodpeckers have moved from the 120 replaced damaged poles to these other poles. 121 122 Mr. Weider asked if the replacement poles will be the same height. Mr. Fennell noted they will be 5-10' 123 higher to provide for future upgrades of transmission service lines. 124 125 Mr. Snyder asked if the conductors will be the same. The answer was yes, and the grounding project 126 was done for wood poles only. 127 128 Ms. White noted the project will start in June and take 3-4 months. 129 130 The Board reviewed the draft of the conditions of approval. Mr. Hadik reviewed the hours of 131 construction: The hours would be Monday through Saturday from 7 AM - 6 PM with no construction on 132 a list of certain holidays. There was a query about emergency exceptions. Mr. Hadik noted he would 133 add the following to the hours of construction: "Exceptions to these hours of operation are possible, if, 134 for example, ceasing work and leaving the site would result in leaving unsafe conditions on the site." 135 136 Mr. Hadik stated he will email Eversource a copy of the signed CUP permit once he receives the DES 137 Utility Maintenance Notification number to add to the permit, along with a copy of the approved 138 minutes of the hearing. 139 140 Chair Sullivan closed the hearing to the public at 7:39 PM for deliberations. 141 142 Mr. Snyder moved that the Conditional Use Permit application by Eversource Energy (PSNH) for 143 replacement of select utility structures on transmission lines (373/391-345Kv) in Chester be approved. 144 Mr. Weider seconded the motion, with all in favor and none opposed, approved 5-0-0. 145 146 **Future Meeting Dates** 147 April 24, 2019 – Southwood's Subdivision PH 148 May 8 • May 22 149 150 Adjournment 151 Chair Sullivan motioned to adjourn the meeting.
