

FREQUENTLY-ASKED QUESTIONS

- Can I have help getting onto the bus? Yes, from the door of your home up to and inside the vehicle
- Will the bus park near my door?

Yes, the driver will park as close to the door as possible, including in your driveway if possible.

- If I have a walker or wheelchair, how does that work? When you make your first appointment on the phone, MTA staff will ask about mobility aids and accommodate accordingly.
- Can I bring someone with me?
 Yes! When calling to make the appointment, just let us know that a buddy will be coming along.



• Is there a cost for CART services?

Yes: \$3 within one CART town, \$4 to multiple towns, \$5 outside of service area. Exact cash fare required. Weekly and monthly passes will be available soon!

• What if I have groceries?

There is plenty of room for groceries on the bus. If you're using a small cart to roll your grocery bag(s), that is allowed as long as it does not block the aisle.

- Can I have help unloading my groceries? Yes, the driver will assist with groceries to the front door
- How far in advance can I make a reservation? Rides can be scheduled as early as one week before but no later than the day before (by 7pm). Both your ride to a location and the return must be scheduled.
- Can I ride from one town into another (i.e. Chester to Derry)? Yes, just make sure to review this with MTA when the ride is initially scheduled.
- What about a return ride; how is that scheduled? Return rides can be scheduled but there must be at least one hour between drop-off and pickup. Both must be scheduled in advance.



• Will MTA remind me of my ride?

Yes. MTA has an automated system that provides a reminder call the night before the ride; this includes the approximate pick up times. There's also a reminder call when the bus is 5 minutes out.

 Are rides limited to medical appointments only?
 In CART towns, you can go anywhere. In Demand-Response towns (Goffstown, Hooksett, New Boston), you can go anywhere within town but medical appointments only outside of it.

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
