This letter serves to confirm that at a duly noticed meeting of the Planning Board held on October 25th, 2023, the Planning Board reviewed a request from James Piper, the Town's Supervisor of Roads, for approval of the release of \$8,235, plus any accrued interest, in offsite improvement fees to be put towards the expenses of the emergency culvert replacement on Lane Road.

The Board determined the proposed expenditure of these offsite improvement fees meet the intent of the provisions under which they were collected. Furthermore, the fees were collected in the same quadrant where they will be expended. The Board then voted to approve the release of the requested fees.

The Board discussed using different amounts from the unassigned fund balance (UFB) to help lower the municipal portion of the tax rate, but Finance Director Smith cautioned the Board to think about future years when utilizing the URB to lower the tax rate.

Chairman Myette suggested preserving the UFB to be used to fund future warrant articles.

Selectwoman Theokas agrees that this tax rate represents what the voters approved, and we don't want to get rid of services.

Vice Chairman Couture is in favor of utilizing a total of \$400K of the UFB, adding that \$200K of the UFB may be needed to cover the Lane Road repairs.

Vice Chairman Couture motioned to request \$200K from the unassigned fund balance to offset taxes. Selectwoman Theokas seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken Myette – nay, Trasknay, Theokas –aye, Couture –aye, Landau – nay. With two in favor, the motion failed.

Selectman Landau felt more of the UFB should be used to offset the taxes.

Selectman Landau motioned to request \$300K from the unassigned fund balance to offset taxes. Selectman Trask seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken Myette – aye, Trask– nay, Theokas –nay, Couture –aye, Landau – aye. With three in favor, the motion passed.

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Chairman Myette led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

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1.4 Chairman's Additions or Deletions

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69 Chairman Myette deleted item *3.1, Ortins,* from the agenda.

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Public Comment

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Chairman Myette opened the meeting to public comment at 6:01pm.

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77 78 Mr. Latham, Donna Street, asked the Board when Carkin Street would be fixed. Selectman Trask replied the Town is working on it. The engineering has been completed. Chairman Myette pointed out the drainage issue has been fixed and the road is not flooding. Culverts need to be replaced. The estimates will be coming soon and there will be a warrant article at Town Meeting for approval for the project.

Mr. Latham mentioned there is also an issue with the plowing on Donna Street.

Mr. Putnam, Haverhill Road, has an issue with drainage from Haverhill Road onto his property and needs guidance. Chairman Myette suggested to speak to Town Planner Hadik for the design and Mr. Piper, Supervisor of Roads, to look at the issue.

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SOR Piper noted that Haverhill Road is a State road and the State would need to be contacted.

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As no other Members of the Public wished to be heard, Public Comment was closed at 6:07pm.

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II. Public Hearings

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2.1 Dogs at Spring Hill Farm

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Selectman Trask motioned to open the public hearing for Dogs at Spring Hill Farm. Vice Chairman Couture seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken Myette – aye, Trask– aye, Theokas – aye, Couture – aye, Landau – aye. With all in favor, the motion passed.

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The public hearing opened at 6:08pm and will stay open for one hour.

Ms. Sautter mentioned the Spring Hill Farm Advisory Committee (SHFAC) has been working hard to get visitors to the farm. Incidents with loose dogs were mentioned. A proposal for regulations similar to the ones at Wason Pond is being proposed.

Ms. Snyder stated with the increased use there have been more and more dogs. Selectman Landau inquired if the service dog exception needed to be on the document.

Selectwoman Theokas inquired how this would be enforced. Ms. Sautter mentioned the SHFAC has talked about it. They thought perhaps the Park Ranger could cruise through the farm randomly.

Mr. Chouinard, Harantis Lake Road, mentioned the sensitive habitat of wild animals. Having dogs run loose could spook an animal. He feels this leash regulation is a good idea because inevitably the Town will have an issue. Mr. Chouinard pointed out if a dog is off leash and charges someone, they may feel threatened and may defend themselves.

Mr. Hadik, Chester Street, asked if this proposal pertained to all ~450 acres of the property. It will just be for the farm and trails on Towle Road, not the Lane Road property. Mr. Hadik pointed out the Wason Pond "leash law" was never approved by the townspeople. Town Administrator Doda stated per RSA it is the Selectboard's right to manage town owned property (and clarified later in the meeting that this was a regulation, not an ordinance).

Vice Chairman Couture would like the property identified in the document. Town Administrator Doda will add the maps and lots numbers.

As no further comments were forthcoming, the Selectboard moved on to the next public hearing.

2.2 UFB for Lane Road & Request for Impact and Offsite Improvement Fees

Selectman Trask motioned to open the public hearing for Lane Road. Vice Chairman Couture seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken Myette – aye, Trask– aye, Theokas – aye, Couture – aye, Landau – aye. With all in favor, the motion passed.

The public hearing opened at 6:25pm and will stay open for one hour.

Chairman Myette explained that the Lane Road wash out at the end of July was an emergency and not planned for in the budget. The Planning Board approved the use of impact fees and offsite improvements fees to help offset the \$203K that has been spent on the repairs. Ms. Lamphere, Town Treasurer, feels there is more money available in the general highway impact fee account created in 2011.

Mr. Brown, Lane Road, commended the Supervisor of Roads and the Police Department for their response to the situation. Kudos to Mr. Piper, the highway crew, and Bolduc Tree Services for the cleanup downstream. Although they were able to get a lot of debris, there is residual debris on the property and in the wetlands. Mr. Brown is uncomfortable with DES not visiting the site.

146 Chairman Myette thanked Mr. Brown for staying at the scene until the Police arrived to close the 147 road. He thanked Mr. Piper and also former Road Agent Oleson for the relationship he built with the 148 contractors over the years. The road was fixed ahead of schedule.

Chairman Myette suggested following up with DES about the debris downstream. Town Administrator Doda read a letter from DES stating no further work is required on Lane Road. Mr. Oleson stated in the past the requirement was to remove all the asphalt. Vice Chairman Couture mentioned he works for DES and can not comment on the subject. As no further comments were forthcoming, the Selectboard moved on to the next public hearing. 2.3 Converting Class VI portion of Dump Road to Class V Vice Chairman Couture motioned to open the public hearing to convert a portion of Dump Road to Class V. Selectman Trask seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken Myette - aye, Trask-aye, Theokas - aye, Couture - aye, Landau - aye. With all in favor, the motion passed. The public hearing opened at 6:44pm and will stay open for one hour. Mr. Remillard mentioned there are problems every year with the dirt portion of Dump Road leading up to the Highway Shed. Mr. Remillard has worked with former Road Agent Oleson in the past to keep it passable in the winter. Mr. Remillard thought it would be great to work with the Town and pave a section of the road to get rid of the issues. Chairman Myette mentioned the part of Dump Road from 102 to the Transfer Station is Class V and past the Transfer Station is Class VI. Because it is a Class VI road, the Town cannot spend funds on it. If it is opened it will need to be maintained by the Town. Selectman Landau asked what standard the road will be built to. It will be built to a Class IV standard. Mr. Oleson, Chester Street, is in support of this. There have been issues for years with vehicles trying to get to the salt shed. This is free labor for the town. Selectwoman Theokas stated the Town is already plowing, and this will make it easier for people to get to the shed. As no further comments were forthcoming, the Selectboard moved on; the public hearings will remain open. III. Appointments 3.1 Ortins – Composting follow up (deleted from the agenda) 3.2 Scarecrows: Historical Society

 Chairman Myette presented a proclamation to Mr. Methot and Mr. Shackleford, members of the Historical Society, from Congressman Pappas recognizing the Chester Historical Society's annual scarecrow celebration.

IV. New Business

4.1 Engineering RFP Opening

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Chairman Myette opened the proposals for engineering from Dubois & King, Gale Associates, and Underwood Engineers. The Board will review the packets over the next few weeks and make a decision.

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4.2 Wage Matrix Review (COLA)

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Town Administrator Doda mentioned last year the matrix was adjusted by 3%. The CIP in September is 2.6% and inflation is at 3.7%.

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Selectman Trask motioned to discuss the wage matrix. Selectman Landau seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken Myette - aye, Trask- aye, Theokas - aye, Couture - aye, Landau - aye. With all in favor, the motion passed.

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Selectman Trask mentioned last year the employees were given 3% when CPI was at 8.1%.

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Selectman Landau feels the employees know they have a job and last year was not a great year. Selectman Landau has always supported the employees, but he also needs to support the town. Vice Chairman Couture reminded the Board the employees were given a bonus last year.

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220 Selectman Trask suggested a 5% increase. Selectman Landau mentioned the Board should also be looking at the benefits. Town Administrator Doda stated the rates are in for benefits next year. Medical is going up 14.6%, Dental up 4.7%, Short term disability down 1.3%, and long term will be going down 15%. 223

Selectwoman Theokas motioned to approve a 3% increase. Vice Chairman Couture seconded the motion.

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Chairman Myette feels the Board should look at the numbers for the budget. He agreed with seeing what the different numbers will do to the budget.



Town Administrator's Report October 28th - November 10th, 2023


- 1. Christmas: Selectman Trask has taken over the Christmas tree search. We do need to know when it might be available/installed in order to let the CCC know, as they would like to hold a Carol Sing.
- **2.** Dump Road: There's been a lot of angst recently about the nomenclature of "Dump Road" vs "Town Dump Road". The Town appears to lean more towards "Dump Road", although it was never officially named most importantly, 911 uses "Dump Road". Counsel has advised that you should simply motion and vote at a regularly scheduled meeting to officially choose one name or the other and then change anything we have that refers to the other name.
- 3. Highway: It's been confirmed that the State will be providing additional Road and Bridge Aid again this year. Road aid arrived today \$41,273.48 and Bridge aid will apparently be available in late November to early December. Road aid was $\sim 33\%$ of last year's figure, and it's estimated that Bridge Aid will be $\sim 27\%$ of last year's amount, so if that remains true then perhaps $\sim $25,903$ for bridges. We'll need to hold a Public Hearing when both amounts are received and vote to accept them as unanticipated revenue.

The sand/salt pile for residents is in place and ready for business.

- **4.** Insurance: A representative from AFLAC is visiting on Monday, November 13th to gauge interest in their products. If offered, this would not be at any cost to the Town.
- **5.** Maintenance: The old floor scrubber and spare batteries that were posted on Municibid all sold; the battery charger did not. Receipts will be handed in to the Town Clerk and be deposited to the General Fund (from whence they will eventually lapse to the UFB). The charger has been relisted.
- **6.** MPR: We had heat issues over Veterans' Day weekend which have yet to be fixed; a particular board in the furnace was burnt out and the tech was searching for a replacement. We moved the Seniors from the MPR to Stevens Hall for the Tuesday November 14th coffee hour.
- **7.** Sanitation: All porta potties have been removed from Town-owned properties until next Spring.
- **8.** Stevens Hall: We had heat issues over Veterans' Day weekend which have been fixed.
- **9.** Tax Bills: Tax Bills were mailed out on Wednesday, November 8th, and are due December 11th. As a reminder, the rate was set as follows (showing education split, and combined):

- **10.** Town Hall: We had some recurring internet problems which were most problematic to the Town Clerk/Tax Collector and Police Departments; Granite State Telecommunications came on Tuesday, November 7th and replaced some old equipment. I haven't heard any complaints since.
- **11.**Transfer Station: Rich Bellemore, Darrell Quinn, and Russ Ouwerkerk replaced the non-functioning yard hydrant last week and we are almost back in business Paul is ordering 'non-potable water' signs and once those are installed Myrick will inspect and sign off.

We're going to need to close the Brush Pile on Wednesday nights for the remainder of the Winter season, since it's just too dark down there for safety.
