The Farm is located on ancestral homelands of the Abenaki, Penacook, and Wabanaki Peoples, past and present. We honor with gratitude the flora, fauna, the land itself, and the people who have stewarded it throughout the generations.

## **A Brief History**

Muriel Church was a schoolteacher in Chester for nearly 50 years, from 1945 to 1995. A single woman, who considered the townspeople her family, she decided at the end of her life to give her 400-acre property \*to the Town. Her wish was to protect the open spaces and historic buildings from residential development, continue the legacy of Chester's farming culture and rural lifestyle, and provide for recreation, education, and conservation.

Today, the *Spring Hill Farm Trust*, the *Town of Chester*, and the *Spring Hill Farm Advisory Committee* are working together to restore and renovate this wonderful unique place to grow, play, and learn.

# Conservation is a Top Priority

Members of the Committee are working with the <u>Rockingham County Conservation District</u>, the <u>NH</u> <u>Department of Natural Resources</u>, and the <u>NH</u> <u>Fish and Game Department</u> to abate invasive plant species and protect resident animal species that nest on the Spring Hill Farm property. We work cooperatively with the <u>Chester Conservation</u> <u>Commission</u>, <u>Recreation Department</u>, <u>land-lease</u> <u>tenants</u>, the <u>NH Trail Riders Association</u>, <u>local</u> <u>Scout Troops</u>, and other local area groups to protect and conserve this tremendous natural resource that is significant in its history, its size, and the scope of its potential use for current and future generations in Town.

## Modern Agricultural Use Today

- Local cattle farmers lease pasture and barn space and graze a small, growing herd of cows on the property.
- Hay grown and harvested on the property annually is sold to local farms and livestock owners. Profits from the sales go back to the operation of the farm.
- Organic growers run a CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) garden and offer shares of locally grown produce to the public. They also raise goats on the property, which earn their keep by eating several invasive vegetation species to develop growing space.
- All of these activities make the historic Spring Hill Farm property a modern working farm that is contributing to its own self-sustaining future.
