36			Mr. Desiderio reported that for August, the electricity expense for the barn was \$20.27 and \$17.96 for the farmhouse, leaving a total in the fund of \$2,996.36.

40			For September, the electricity expense for the barn was \$17.17 and \$18.28 for the farmhouse. The annual insurance payment was \$602.00. This leaves a total of \$2,288.91 in the main fund. The balance in the Advisory fund is \$1,440.01.

44 Ms. Snyder moved to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Ms. Rairdon seconded the motion. A vote was taken, all were in favor. The motion passed 46 unanimously. The Committee discussed the insurance expense, which covers the use of the tractors 48 and Trust equipment. It does not cover the barn or liability on the house. Selectman 50 Landau pointed out the Trust is a separate trust; the liability for the buildings is covered by the Town. The equipment is not owned by the Town. The Committee 52 discussed which line the insurance cost is in. D. Cattlemen Update 54 The cattlemen were not present to provide an update. 56 E. Geary Farms Update 58 Nick and Christy Ortins were not present to provide an update. They did send an email, noting they have moved their chickens and goats onto the farm. The goats will 60 eventually come to the farm and are intended to help eradicate the bittersweet. 62 F. Review of Fall Fest Ms. LeBlanc reported the fest went very well. There were approximately 200 attendees. There were more vendors than in the past and they want to return next 64 year. The Facebook advertising was successful, but there were suggestions that it should have been created as an event. She thanked Ms. Rairdon and her mother for 66 their help. Mr. Myette noted the Select Board was very complimentary about the 68 fest. 70 The Committee noted the parking lot exit signage needs to be improved. Drivers did not see the exit and attempted to leave via the entrance.
